Proper Tree Planting Workshop

On Wednesday, October 26, 2022, the Massachusetts Tree Wardens' and Foresters' Association convened a Proper Tree Planting course. The Professional Development Series committee, led by Dave Lefcourt of Cambridge, arranged a half-day course at the Needham, DPW. Despite a little rain, 35 local tree wardens and tree crew workers started the day in the classroom and received step by step instruction in Proper Tree Planting Techniques including when to plant, how deep to plant a tree, and proper mulching techniques. Participants also learned about site selection.

The class culminated with several actual plantings of different types of nursery stock. MTWFA has been hosting tree planting workshops around Massachusetts since September 2013.



Updates from the Department of Conservation and Recreation

Tree City USA

Application Deadline is December 31, 2022

Tree City USA is a program that recognizes towns and cities of all sizes for their work in managing community trees and provides a mechanism to help communities maintain or expand their urban forest.

It's free to apply! The DCR reviews Tree City USA applications from Massachusetts to ensure that the information is current, accurate, and complete. They then recommend applicants for the award to the Arbor Day Foundation.

The Arbor Day Foundation now makes the entire application process available on-line. The DCR prefers that Cities and Towns use this on-line tool for the application process.

Already a Tree City USA? Check out the Growth Award. The Arbor Day Foundation has completely overhauled the award criteria. Urban and community forestry efforts in five categories are eligible for the Growth Award: Building the Team; Measuring Trees and Forests; Planning the Work; Performing the Work; and the Community Framework.

The City of Boston Announces the Completion of its Urban Forest Plan

Planning for Boston's Urban Forest Plan began in spring 2021 and involved many partners and stakeholders from the community. The

City established a Community Advisory Board that developed the plan, with input from the community as well.

The result is a long-term strategic plan "to create a sustainable and equitable urban forest in Boston."

The plan identifies four goals:

1. Equity First - Focus investments and improvements in under-canopied, historically excluded and socially vulnerable areas; 2. Proactive Care and


Preservation - Ensure trees/tree canopy are proactively cared for; **3. Community-led** - Ensure community priorities drive urban forest decisions and management; 4. Prioritize and Value Trees - Increase awareness and buy-in regarding the importance of trees

in Boston across the public and private sectors. These four goals are supported by recommendations and action items that comprise the bulk of the plan. The city plans to evaluate progress every five to ten years.

The plan utilized existing data, such as the Urban Tree Canopy Assessment data from 2014 and 2019, newly-collected street tree inventory data from 2021, Heat Resilient Solutions for Boston data, city GIS-data, and community input.

The plan has already borne positive results, with 11 new staff positions funded and organized in a new Forestry Division of the Boston Parks and Recreation Department. This division will have 16 staff members dedicated to management of the city's trees.

Every tree warden knows that trees face a variety of challenges in communities from restricted planting space, salt, soil, heat, drought, insects, disease, conflicts with other infrastructure, development, not enough staff or funding, and more. Assessing what is in the community (and where!) and planning to maintain it for the short and long haul can benefit communities of all sizes.


Survey Alert

This survey is part of an initiative by the University of Massachusetts in Amherst, MA (UMass Amherst) on behalf of the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) to understand best practices for tree preservation nationwide. The information gathered in this process will help to guide the creation of a manual to inform future actions to preserve and protect our urban forests.

The MTWFA sells seedlings to fund its scholarship program and to promote Arbor Day and tree planting.

Municipalities, garden clubs, private firms, arborists, non-profits, and others have all purchased seedlings in the past.

Seedling orders are due in April for delivery in time for Arbor Day. Stay tuned for details!

MTWFA Scholarships

Last year, the Massachusetts Tree Wardens' and Foresters' Association awarded scholarships to students actively studying arboriculture, community forest management, urban forestry, or a related field. Scholarships range from \$500-\$1,500 per student.

An applicant must be either:

- A student attending an accredited college or university in Massachusetts; or a Massachusetts resident attending an accredited out-of-state college or university; or
- A high school senior who will be attending an accredited college or university in the fall of the application year.

An applicant must be enrolled or planning to be enrolled in a program of arboriculture, community forest management, urban forestry, or a related field.

A college or university applicant must have completed at least one college semester in one of these programs. High school seniors granted an award must request the payment after submitting their first-semester college transcript.

Award decisions are based on financial need and an acceptable grade point average.

Applications are due by February 15th.
